

# Jensen Gin

## Tasting Notes

### Jensen's Old Tom Gin

---

**Nose:** More intense than the Jensen's Dry, and again the juniper is very prominent, this time accompanied by grapefruit notes, lavender, coriander and a very pleasant meadowy character. Becomes more floral with time, with hints of orange flower water.

**Palate:** Extremely concentrated blend of the botanical aromas from the nose: juniper, liquorice, some citrus. Strong violet and lavender mid-palate. A slightly cereally background with sage and a natural residual sweetness.

**Finish:** Long and powerful with the citrus, juniper, liquorice and floral notes all lingering. A slightly menthol quality.

**Comment:** More challenging than the Dry due to the powerful, uncompromising flavours. Perhaps less approachable neat for this reason, but this Old Tom will be a knockout in the right cocktails.

### Jensen's Bermondsey Gin

---

**Nose:** Very strong juniper aroma. A sappy pine character with a lot of fresh coriander and liquorice. Hints of fresh ginger, resin, violet and uncooked runner beans.

**Palate:** Very clean and soft. Again, juniper dominates. The liquorice is also noticeable, alongside a grassiness with tingling spice.

**Finish:** The liquorice carries through to the death with the piney juniper, fresh cut grass, coarse-ground pepper and spices.

**Comment:** Much more approachable than standard issue London Dry. The silky-soft texture makes this easy to drink neat.
